## CAMPUS FACILITIES

In 1990 CSUSM opened for the first time in a temporary storefront location while the main campus on Twin Oaks Valley Road was under construction. The first three buildings were Craven Hall, Academic Hall and University Hall.

Today the campus has more than a million square feet of facilities, including the recently completed four-story University Student Union, the Student Health and Counseling Services Building and the Veterans Center. CSUSM also has over 150 teaching and research labs, as well as several art venues and 20 art studios and digital media labs.



### POINTS OF PRIDE

► **Kellogg Library** houses 538,203 total volumes (print and digital) and 13,478 sound and film recordings, as well as several industry-grade video and music recording studios.

► **The Center for Children and Families**, opened in 2007, is a state-of-the-art daycare, preschool and kindergarten facility, which offers quality childcare for students, faculty, staff and the community. The Center also acts as a resource to various programs on campus, including psychology, nursing and education, providing students with one-way observation areas and cameras for distance observation and teaching.

► Living in student housing is the ultimate way for students to experience CSUSM. Housing options include the **University Village Apartments**, opened in 2003, and **The QUAD**, opened in 2012. The total number of students living in residential housing is just over 1,500.



### GROWTH

Expected to open in time for the fall 2016 season, the new 25,000-square foot Sports Center, an NCAA Division II-compliant facility, will include a 1,400-seat basketball court and gym. Go Cougars!




## ECONOMIC IMPACT OF THE CSU

## INCREASED ACCESS




