Our faculty are leading researchers who strive to provide deep learning experiences through innovative teaching, helping students grasp and apply content in their various disciplines. Every student has the opportunity to engage with faculty and with each other while learning about complex subjects.

CSUSM has over 150 state-of-the-art teaching and research labs, as well as art venues and 20 art studios and digital media labs.

An initiative that provides 24-hour, 5-day-a-week access to the University Library was launched through a partnership with Associated Students, Inc., giving students access to study spaces and the collections at any hour.

In addition to 40 bachelor degree programs and 47 minors, CSUSM offers 25 master's programs, six credential programs and a joint doctoral program with UC San Diego.

The campus has more than 1 million square feet of facilities, averaging one new facility a year since 2004. In August 2019 another new building will open to house Extended Learning and student academic support centers. A leader in sustainability, CSUSM's buildings are designed and built to create minimal environmental impact. Working with campus dining and facilities partners, CSUSM reduces waste, improves recycling rates and increases energy efficiency.

CAMPUS HOUSING

TEMECULA CAMPUS

Celebrating its 10th anniversary in 2019, CSUSM at Temecula provides residents of Southwest Riverside County with access to the only public higher education institution beyond community college. This state-of-the-art campus offers an array of educational programs including graduate and undergraduate-level university degrees and professional development programs which meet the current and future workforce needs of the region.

COUGARS ATHLETICS

The Sports Center, CSUSM's first indoor home court, makes it easy for students and the community to cheer Cougars athletics teams to victory. In 2017, Athletics completed the candidacy process to become a full member of the NCAA Division II. In 2018-2019 athletics celebrates its 20th anniversary. Facing strong opposition in the competitive California Collegiate Athletic Association conference, teams have risen to the challenge, many qualifying for postseason play.

CSUSM continues to respond to the needs of the region, creating new academic programs such as engineering and wildfire science and urban interface.



WHO WE ARE

Building on an innovative 29-year history, California State University San Marcos is a forward-focused institution, dedicated to preparing future leaders, building great communities and solving critical issues. Located on a 304-acre hillside overlooking the City of San Marcos, the university is a short distance from some of Southern California's best beaches and an hour from the U.S.-Mexico border.

The university enrolls nearly 17,000 students. Since 2014 CSUSM has been the recipient of the annual HEED award, a national honor recognizing U.S. colleges and universities that demonstrate a commitment to diversity and inclusion. CSUSM is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges.

Forty-five percent of students come from traditionally underrepresented backgrounds, including veterans, former foster youth and American Indian students, and over half

are first in their families to earn a bachelor's degree. The student body's diversity of experiences, backgrounds and perspectives is what makes our university and our region stronger.


